My Cat is Going to the Bathroom Outside the Litter Box – HELP!

Feline house-soiling can be a common and frustrating problem that many cat owners have, and it is one of the most common reasons that owned cats are relinquished to animal shelters.

First - Take your cat to your veterinarian to make sure they don't have a medical problem that is contributing to the behavioural problem.

Next - Look at your cat's environment. They may be stressed or anxious from other pets, children, changes in the household, and the litter box itself.

Some General Litter Box Tips:

Number of Boxes:

Have 1 litter box per cat + 1. If you have 1 cat, you should have 2 litter boxes, and if you have 2 cats you should have 3 boxes. Note: 3 litter boxes side-by-side is considered 1 litter station.

Location:

Have one litter box on each floor of your house; don't locate litter box next to a furnace or central vac that can abruptly make a loud noise and frighten your cat.

Type of litter:

Ensure you provide a variety of substrates for your cat to choose from. It is best to avoid dusty, scented litters. The most readily accepted litter amongst cats is unscented clumping. Different cats prefer different textures and amounts of litter, so you may need to experiment.

Type of box:

Ensure that the size of the box is large enough to accommodate your cat. If your cat is overweight or has arthritis, then providing them with a large low sided box can help. If you prefer a covered box, then provide both a covered box, and a box without a lid; most cats actually prefer to use a non-covered box.

Cleaning:

Keep the litter box clean! Make sure you scoop your cat's box at least once daily. Cats don't like a dirty litter box anymore than we do! When washing the litter box, don't use any harsh chemicals such as bleach.

Rosewood Updates

Glen H. Penner Park Development

This park was named after Glen Penner a former City of Saskatoon council member. He was elected in 1972 and retired in 2012 after serving 26 years on council.

The City of Saskatoon held an open house on November 12, 2015 to provide Rosewood residents an opportunity to consult with the City on what they would like to see in their neighbourhood park. A Shaping Saskatoon survey was also open until November 30, 2015 for residents to provide comments.

Information received during the open house and comments from the survey will be used by the City as they work on the design phase of the park concept plan.

Once the concept plan is complete, the City will host another meeting in the Spring of 2016 with Rosewood residents to gather feedback before beginning construction. Stay tuned for more details!

Rosewood Elementary School

Work has begun on the school site with a sod turning in September 2015. Pile driving and the footings were being installed this fall and is expected to be completed before the end of 2015. Completion of the school is still anticipated to be in 2017, however this is subject to change. The Catholic School will be called St. Therese (of Lisieux) Catholic School. The Saskatoon School Board has still not confirmed the official name for the public school.

Road Construction

Boychuk Drive / Highway 16 Interchange

October 26, 2015 City Council passed a motion to support the funding application for the Boychuk and Highway 16 Interchange.

Once funding is in place, the City will issue a Request for Qualifications (RFQ). From the Contractors that submit RFQs the City will develop a short list. The short listed Contractors will then be sent a Request for Proposals (RFP). Once the City receives, reviews and evaluates these proposals, the work will be awarded to the successful Contractor.

It was anticipated that if the funding was in place this fall there was a possibility a Contractor might be in place by the Summer of 2016. Once the RFQ and RFP is underway a better timeframe will be established.

Zimmerman Road/ Highway 16 Interchange

Zimmerman Road is currently under construction. The roadway, intersection and traffic signals will be installed with completion slated the Summer of 2016. This completion date is subject to change.

A parcel of land east of Zimmerman Road was added to Rosewood in 2014. This will be an employment area consisting of commercial and light industrial land uses such as Costco along with other retailers.

Roadway access to the Rosewood neighbourhood from Highway 16, was originally proposed via Rosewood Gate South, however that access point was removed in 2014 and is now via Zimmerman Road.

Swick Park

Swick Park along Rosewood Boulevard is almost complete. The basketball hoop, fence and a few other items are incomplete. If you are in or around the park area please be aware of the potential hazards during construction. Also, remember that it will still take some time for the grass and landscaping to fully establish.

Rosewood Updates

Hyde Park Naturalized Area Weir Repairs

During the Spring of 2016 you will notice work taking place on the weir by the bridge. It has been determined that the water levels in the wetlands are not being maintained properly due to malfunctions with the weir. The City has advised the RCA board that they will be sending out a notice to Rosewood residents prior to work commencing with further details. It is anticipated that once the work begins it will take approximately two weeks to complete. Minimal impact to wildlife is anticipated during the repairs, however there may be restrictions on pathway use.

Rosewood Entrance Signage

The first Rosewood entrance sign has been completely installed at the Boychuk Drive/Rosewood Boulevard West entrance. There will be signs placed at each entrance to Rosewood as development progresses in our community. A sign is planned for the Taylor Street East/Rosewood Gate North entrance in the near future.

Proposed Street Renaming

Due to revisions to the Rosewood Concept Plan in 2014 that eliminated Highway 16 access along Rosewood Gate South, the City of Saskatoon Naming Advisory Committee was requesting to change the name of Rosewood Gate North.

The intent was to eliminate conflicts with current addressing that may affect mail delivery, wayfinding, and emergency services. Residents affected by the potential name change were notified by the City.

The City has decided not to proceed at this time with the renaming.

Interesting Facts About Saskatchewan...

1. The Old Bone Trail was a short but common route connecting smaller settlements southwest of Saskatoon to the city's bone market. Merchants and settlers began to collect and sell Bison bones until the animals became virtually extinct in the late 1880s. The bones were collected in Saskatoon and sold to buyers in the United States for use in fertilizer, or as a colouring agent in paint and ink; the average return for a tonne of bison bones was \$8. Homesteaders replaced bone merchants on the trail after 1900, particularly Barr colonists passing through Saskatoon en route to Lloydminster, Alberta. It is estimated that 10,000 settlers traveled the Bone Trail between 1904 and 1905.
2. The current operational infrastructure for Saskatchewan Highways and Transportation (the government department responsible for the operation and preservation of the province's transportation system) includes more than 131 km of ice roads. The majority of these roads are located in northern Saskatchewan. The only major exception is the Riverhurst Crossing, an ice road constructed each year at Riverhurst and allowing vehicles to cross Lake Diefenbaker. The northern ice roads allow winter access to the communities of Wollaston Lake, Fond du Lac, and Uranium City. During the summer these communities are accessible by either watercraft or aircraft. Many other ice roads previously existed in northern Saskatchewan, but are no longer in commercial use. They included an extension of Highway 955 (Semchuk Trail) to Uranium City, built in 1955–56 by Martin Semchuk, John Midgett and Jonas Clarke; and an ice road from Flin Flon to Reindeer Lake, built by the Sigfusson Transportation Company (Winnipeg) in 1945.
3. A rare winter phenomenon, a snow roller is formed when the wind blows wet snow into a roll. Three weather conditions must occur simultaneously and in the proper order for snow rollers to take shape. First, there has to be sufficient accumulation of light, fluffy snow. Secondly, once the snow has stopped falling, the temperature has to rise above the freezing mark, making the snow sticky. Finally, a strong wind is required to roll the snow up in layers. If the wind is strong enough, the moving ball of snow becomes cylindrical, often with a hole through it lengthwise. Snow rollers range in size from that of eggs to small barrels. Their tracks are sometimes several metres long and less than one centimetre deep. Recorded snow roller sightings have occurred in Regina on December 25, 1993, and near Willow Bunch in February 2001.
4. Born in 1885, David Webster was one of Saskatoon's first architects, opening his practice in 1906. He was responsible for the design of the castle-style Saskatoon schools built between 1910 and 1914: Caswell, Albert, King Edward, Westmount, King George, and Sutherland. Other well-known projects from this period include the King George Hotel, City Hospital Nurses' Residence on King Street, and Hopkins House on Saskatchewan Crescent West. From 1915 to 1918 Webster served in wartime Europe; he resumed his practice in 1919. Post-war projects included the Modern Press Building, Royal Canadian Legion on 19th Street, the Capital Theatre (associate architect), the Saskatchewan Normal School, Saskatoon Police Station, and the Post Office Building. In 1930 he formed a partnership with Edward Gilbert. During the lean years of the 1930s their major projects included Saskatoon Armouries, Davis Dairies, Saskatoon City Hall and Civic Centre, and the Ukrainian National Federation Hall.


In 1939 his son John became a partner in the firm, and Webster left to become Deputy Minister of Public Works for Saskatchewan until 1948, leaving to supervise the construction of University Hospital until 1950. Webster was elected a Fellow of the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada in 1930. He held membership card Number One from the Saskatchewan Association of Architects, and served as Association president for six terms between 1918 and 1936. David Webster died on January 01, 1952.

Vehicle Safety Tips

Here are a few tips to remember before you drive. Keep yourself and other drivers/pedestrians safe.

Take the time to do the following:

- * Remove the snow from your vehicle, including hood, top and trunk as this can pose a danger to other drivers;
- * Scrape the windshield, rear and side windows;
- * Wait for your windows to defrost and to clear completely;
- * Clean snow from your headlights, taillights and signal light; and
- * Drive with your headlights on at all times. Even on a clear day, swirling snow makes it difficult to see and to be seen.

Notifynow City-Wide Test

Power Outages

The kit should include: flashlight, battery-operated radio, extra batteries, corded landline phone, warm clothes, blankets, first aid kit, water, non-perishable, ready-to-eat foods. Residential Speeding

As Rosewood increases in size, so do the number of passenger, construction vehicles, and pedestrians. A reminder to please slow down, watch for school buses and children entering or exiting buses. Designated crosswalks throughout Rosewood are currently limited so please be a courteous driver, slow down and stop for pedestrians looking to cross the road at intersections.

Even though the speed limit throughout our neighbourhood is 50 km/h, it may be safer to slow down especially now that the weather and road conditions are not always ideal. Remember to drive for road conditions and drive defensively.

If you have a complaint about speeding in Rosewood you can call the City's Transportation Customer Service at 306-975-2454 or complete a [Community Traffic Issue report](#). By completing this online report this will help the City track concerns and potential unsafe traffic conditions in our neighbourhood so they can be properly addressed.

Sidewalk Snow Clearing Bylaw

Residential sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 48 hours of a snowfall. If the City receives a complaint, the site will be checked, and if necessary, the owner/occupant will be asked to clear it.

Street Use Bylaw

Residents are prohibited from throwing or shovelling snow on the road as it can affect drainage and the safety of pedestrians and/or drivers. Cleared snow must be placed on your property or removed, and not placed on the roadway.

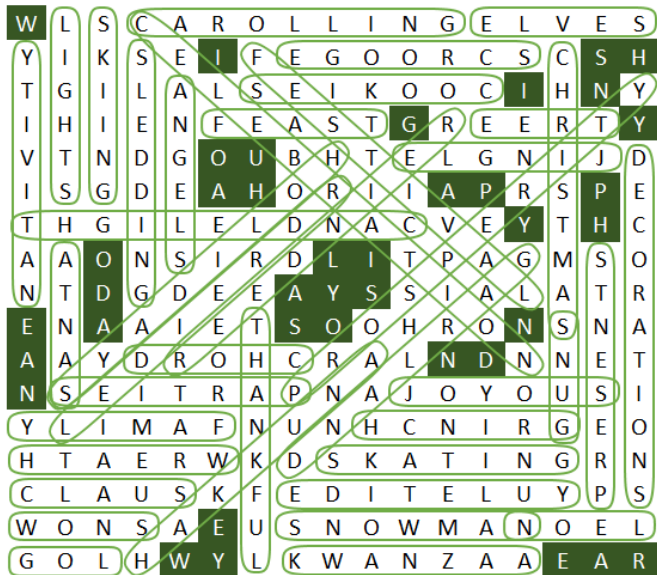
