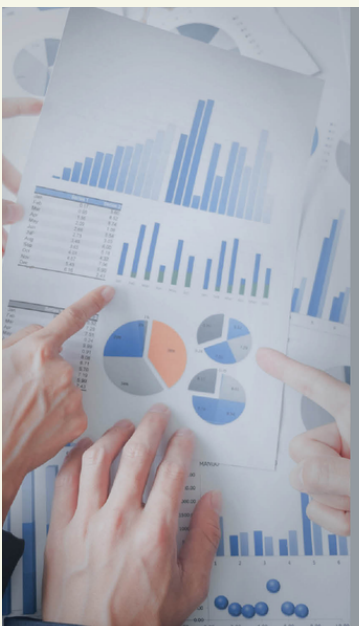


We are seeking **youth ages 10-13, who have not yet had their period, and a parent/caregiver to participate in this important research!**

## GRAFFITI

What can you do if you see Graffiti?

Report graffiti on City of Saskatoon property, public property, and other

The City of Saskatoon removes graffiti from its own property and alerts other external partners through an internal reporting system. You can report graffiti to the City of Saskatoon on all types of utility boxes, schools, parks, Canada Post boxes, dumpsters, signs, bridges, and railways.

What you can expect from us:

1. Average turnaround time to process your Graffiti report is 1 or 2 days, including entering it into our tracking database, assigning it to the correct business unit responsible for that piece of property, and/or contacting our external partners.
2. Business unit responsible may need to visually inspect graffiti manually if no picture is attached in the report.
3. Graffiti report is then prioritized into the system for removal.
4. Obscene, vulgar or hate graffiti is top priority and will be responded to first.
5. Business units target graffiti removal within 7 days of it being reported, subject to resources, safety considerations and weather permitting.
6. You will not receive a call back once removed, but can give us a call if your report is not removed within 30 days.

How you can help us:

1. Report graffiti as soon as possible with detailed information about its location. To report graffiti on residential property call 306-975-2828
2. Include a picture of the graffiti with your report.

Report all incidents of damage to your property by calling Saskatoon Police Service at [306-975-8300](tel:306-975-8300).
