Call Before You Dig

Are you looking at installing a driveway or doing some landscaping around your property this summer? Contact Sask 1st Call which is a one stop service that will notify subscribing companies clearly mark underground facilities before you begin digging.

Plan and mark where you will be digging by using small wooden stakes with survey tape, spray paint or white flags.

Request a free line locate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You must submit your request a minimum of two (2) days ahead of your start date and will need to provide the street address, closest intersection, city, type of work being done and start date.



Once the lines are marked they are valid for 10 working days after that you should contact them for another line locate.

* Note - Privately installed services may not be identified by 1st Call subscribers.

WHAT DO THE FLAG COLOURS MEAN?

WHITE	Limits of proposed excavation
PINK	Temporary survey marks
RED	Electric power lines, cables, conduits and ducts or lighting wires and cables
YELLOW	Gas, oil, petroleum, steam or gaseous materials
ORANGE	Telephone, cable TV, communications, alarm or signal lines, wires, cables, conduits or ducts
BLUE	Potable water lines or pipes
GREEN	Sanitary sewer, storm sewer, culvert or drain lines
PURPLE	Irrigation, reclaimed water or slurry lines or pipes

Easy Recipe

THE ULTIMATE MIXED BEAN SALAD



A summertime staple, this version is sure to please with its fresh taste and colourful hues. Make this salad a day ahead to let the zippy dressing soak into the beans.

Prep Time: 15 minutes

Cook Time: 15 minutes

Makes 8 servings

- * 227 g (8 oz) green beans, trimmed
- * 227 g (8 oz) yellow beans, trimmed
- * 250 mL (1 cup) shelled soy beans (edamame)
- * 1 can (540 mL/19 oz) sodium reduced chickpeas, drained and rinsed
- * 2 stalks celery, thinly sliced
- * 2 green onions, sliced
- * 1 large red bell pepper, chopped
- * 60 mL (1/4 cup) apple cider vinegar
- * 15 mL (1 tbsp) Dijon mustard
- * 15 mL (1 tbsp) canola oil
- * 2 mL (1/2 tsp) fresh ground pepper
- * 60 mL (1/4 cup) each chopped fresh basil and parsley or mint

1. In a saucepan of boiling water, cook green and yellow beans and soy beans for 3 minutes, drain well and rinse under cold water to chill.

2. Cut green and yellow beans into 5 cm (2 inch) pieces. Set bean mixture aside.
3. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, combine chickpeas, celery, green onions and red pepper. Add bean mixture to bowl.
4. In a small bowl, whisk together vinegar, mustard, oil and pepper. Pour over bean mixture and toss to coat. Add basil and parsley and toss again.

TIPS:

You choose the beans. If you prefer, use all green beans or all yellow beans.

If shelled soy beans are not available use lima beans or 250 mL (1 cup) of your favourite sodium reduced canned bean, drained and rinsed.

Little chefs can help trim the beans using their hands to snap off the ends. They can also whisk the dressing together.

This salad keeps on giving. Make ahead, cover and refrigerate for up to two days. Pack some salad with a handful of cheese and crackers for a quick and easy lunch.

Rosewood Updates

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

On April 24, 2018 twenty-five people attended the AGM where a PowerPoint presentation recapped the past year and took a look at where we're heading this year. Thank you so much to Boston Pizza on Slimmon Road for providing pizza and salads!

A special thank you to our outgoing board members Carol Pehuda, Shannon Johnson and Matt Reis for your work over the years.

We would also like to thank our board members that are staying on and extend a warm welcome to our newest board members!

PARK CONSTRUCTION

A reminder that parks are not to be accessed during the construction phase as there may be unseen dangers.

Park concept plans are subject to changes, construction timing is tentative and subject to change. Keep in mind once a park is completed it may take years for them to become established.

Glen H. Penner Park

You can see the progress as work continues on this park by the schools and community centre. The spray pad will be installed and the park is set to be completed the end of the summer.

A tentative concept plan for the outdoor rink and warm up structure has been created. There is no set date for construction of the rink project. The rink will be funded by Rosewood Community Association fundraising efforts. Stay tuned for how you can get involved!

Mackay Park

This park has many access points, one end connects to Swick Park and the other end Olson Lane West. Park construction resumed in the spring and is currently estimated to be completed this summer.

Struthers Park

The tender was awarded in the spring and prep work on the site is getting underway. The tentative completion is October 31, 2018.

Swick Park - Community Garden

In April the City, Rosewood community garden applicants and CHEP Good Food Inc. shared information at an information session about the proposed garden. In May the City approved the Swick Park location.

COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION

Rosewood Boulevard West

Construction of the commercial complex is progressing. On the north side a Medical Clinic and Pharmacy are confirmed tenants and a few spots remain to be leased. On the south side, Evolve Esthetics just opened which leaves one space left in that complex. Rosewood residents are enjoying having more options within walking distance!

Rosewood's Meadows Market

Construction is well underway with many businesses being confirmed including; Co-op Liquor, Dollar Tree, Marshall's, McDonald's, Petsmart, Scotiabank, Tim Horton's and Visions Electronics. The estimated opening date for many tenants is this fall and maybe sooner!

Rosewood Village Square

There are no new updates on the central core commercial area for Rosewood at this time. Stay tuned!

Fire and Safety

OUTDOOR FIRE PITS (NEW PERMITTED HOURS - 2:00 PM TO 11:00 PM)

On April 30, 2018 City Council passed Bylaw No. 9484 The Fire and Protective Services Amendment Bylaw, 2018 to amend the existing Bylaw No. 7990, The Fire and Protective Services, 2001.

BBQ Grills, smokers and outdoor pizza ovens used for food preparation, Chimeneas and permanent upright fireplaces, built in accordance with the National Building Code of Canada, are not subject to the new time regulations in the amended Bylaw No. 9484, 2018.

WHAT SHOULD I USE AS AN OPEN-AIR FIRE PIT?

- * Fires must be contained within a non-combustible fire box constructed of cement, brick or metal of at least 18 gauge.
- * Use protective mesh spark screen cover.
- * Box must not exceed 0.61 metres.



WHERE SHOULD I PUT MY OUTDOOR FIRE PIT?

At least three (3) metres from any combustible materials such as buildings, fences, decks and trees. This is measured from the closest part of the object including any overhanging branches, etc.

WHAT AM I ALLOWED TO BURN?

Only dry, cut seasoned cord wood or charcoal briquettes.

WHEN ARE OUTDOOR FIRES NOT PERMITTED?

- * Outside the hours of 2:00 - 11:00 pm (open-air fire pits).
- * When weather conditions are conducive to creating a running fire or allowing the smoke from the fire to be a nuisance to another person (smoke drift).
- * If smoke from an outdoor fire becomes a nuisance or interferes with the use and enjoyment of another person's property, the fire is to be extinguished immediately.

WHAT AM I NOT ALLOWED TO BURN IN MY BACKYARD IN THE CITY?

Rubbish, garden/yard waste, plastic, manure, livestock or animal carcasses, and any material that produces dense, black smoke including insulation, electrical wiring or equipment, asphalt roofing materials, hydrocarbons, rubber materials, painted or creosote treated wood.

CAN I LEAVE A FIRE PIT BURNING UNATTENDED?

- * Fires are not to be left unattended at any time and require responsible supervision at all times.
- * Always have a source of water nearby to extinguish fires once you are done.
- * Do not leave a fire to burn out on its own unsupervised.

BARBECUES

A reminder to keep your barbecue unit a safe distance from all combustible materials when lit and to never leave a lit barbecue unattended. Remember to check your barbecue regularly to ensure it is in good operating condition and never use a barbecue indoors.



FIREWORKS

Fireworks are permitted on private property only: from dusk to 11:00 p.m. on **Victoria Day, Canada Day and Labour Day.**

- * Adult supervision is required if under 18 years old.
- * Choose a wide, clear site away from overhead obstacles.
- * Do not fire in windy conditions.
- * Read all instructions provided with the fireworks and plan the order of firing before you begin.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety

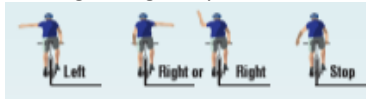
The weather is nice and summer is upon us so there are more people out enjoying the weather. Many new residents have moved in and there is ongoing construction in Rosewood bringing more traffic.

Everyone, whether in a vehicle, on a bike or walking, should be aware of others on or near the road and also watch out for potential hazards.

Hyde Park, Bitz Park and Swick Park are complete, Glen H. Penner Park and Mackay Park are nearing completion, and Struthers Park should be completed this year. These as well as other future parks will provide opportunities for cyclists and pedestrians to safely travel through many areas of Rosewood.

REMINDERS FOR CYCLISTS

- * Cyclists are considered motorists and must obey the same rules of the road as motor vehicles.
- * It is illegal to ride your bike on sidewalks in Saskatoon unless it is marked as a "multi-use pathway". You are permitted to ride your bike on bridges, overpasses and in parks.
- * If using a sidewalk/crosswalk that is not marked for bike riding you must walk your bike.
- * Cyclists are required to sound a horn or bell before passing any pedestrian or cyclist when traveling in the same direction.
- * While biking in a park you should not be speeding past people potentially startling, endangering, or interfering with others.
- * Yield the right of way to pedestrians when riding in a park.
- * It is suggested that you wear a helmet, proper footwear and avoid wearing clothing/accessories that can get caught in your bike.
- * Use hand signals to notify others when making a turn or stopping.



- * Use reflective clothing and other protective equipment depending on your skill level and where you are biking.
- * Consider placing a headlight and reflectors on your bike for better visibility in low light and at night.
- * Ride defensively and be aware of your surroundings.
- * Do not assume motorists, other cyclists or pedestrians can see you and are aware of where you are and where you are going.

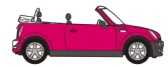
REMINDERS FOR PEDESTRIANS

- * Use designated crosswalks to cross the road.
- * When there is no dedicated crosswalk cross at a corner.
- * Do not assume a vehicle will stop because you step off the curb.
- * Look both ways and ensure it is safe before crossing the road.
- * Walk on the sidewalk not along the edge of the road.
- * Keep in mind that with the bright sun, dawn/dusk and at night drivers and cyclists on the road may not see you.
- * Be careful when walking between parked vehicles.
- * Wear reflective / bright coloured clothes to be seen.



REMINDERS FOR DRIVERS

- * Do not use your phone or text while driving.
- * Stop for pedestrians looking to cross at a crosswalk or corner.
- * Wait until all pedestrians have crossed before continuing to drive.
- * Do not pass a vehicle that is stopped for pedestrians.
- * Be careful driving in school zones and near playgrounds.
- * Use your turn signals when changing lanes or turning.
- * Remember that drivers share the road with cyclists.
- * Drive defensively and pay attention to your surroundings.
- * Ensure that you keep sufficient space between you and the vehicle ahead of you in case you need to stop suddenly.

Pet Safety: Summer Safety Awareness for Pets

HEAT HAZARDS

- * If your pet spends a lot of time outdoors, make sure to provide adequate shelter from the sun and heat
- * Pets that have been shaved down for the summer may require a t-shirt so as not to sun burn
- * ALWAYS provide plenty of fresh water in a cool shaded area for pets
- * On hot days, exercise your pet in the early morning, or late evening
- * Beware of hot asphalt; it can burn your pet's sensitive feet
- * NEVER leave your pet in an unattended vehicle – temperatures can rise to dangerous levels and cause heat stroke in a matter of minutes



FLEAS, TICKS, AND MOSQUITOES

Many over-the-counter flea/tick medications can be lethally toxic to cats, so ensure you speak with your veterinarian about which products are safe to use on or around your pets.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU FIND A TICK ON YOUR PET? ... DON'T PANIC!

- * Grasp the base of the tick firmly nearest the skin (where the head is burrowed)
- * Pull straight out with steady even pressure (no jerking)
- * Clean the area with a small amount of rubbing alcohol
- * Monitor the area for any swelling/redness.
- * If you are not comfortable removing the tick yourself, call your veterinarian. Many pet stores/veterinary clinics also sell tick removing instruments you can keep on hand.



WATER SAFETY AND SWIMMING

- * Be very careful when exercising your pet around the river – even the best swimmers can drown in the undertow currents
- * NEVER throw your pet into the lake, river, or swimming pool
- * When out boating, your pet should ALWAYS wear a specially designed life preserver which are available at most pet stores
- * Know your dog's limits when swimming and don't let them overdo it. Swimming is vigorous exercise and they can tire quickly
- * ALWAYS supervise your pets around backyard swimming pools; ensure that your pet knows where the stairs/ladders are located, and that pool covers are firmly in place



THUNDERSTORMS AND FIREWORKS

Many pets become anxious with the loud noises associated with thunderstorms, and fireworks. Pet's will often hide, shake, or run away during these events. It can be as simple as using special clothing such as the ThunderShirt to help your anxious pet through these events safely.



TRAVELLING

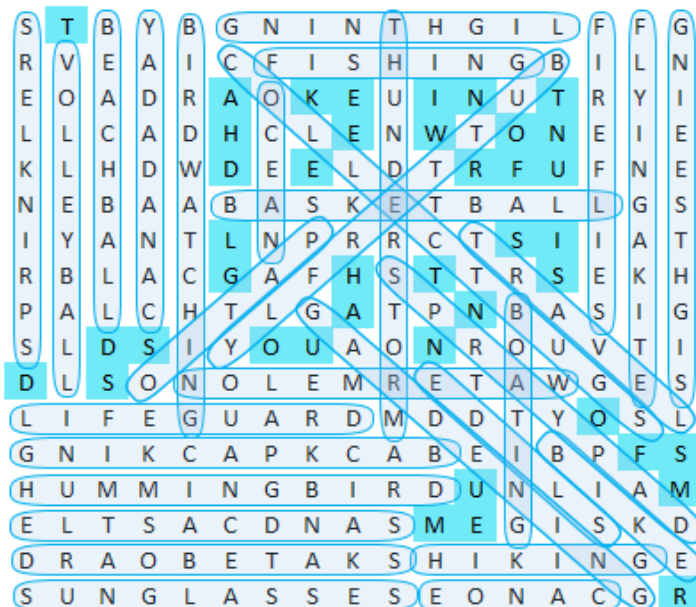
If you are traveling outside of Saskatchewan with your pets, be sure to ask your veterinarian if your pet requires any additional vaccines, or heartworm preventive medication.
