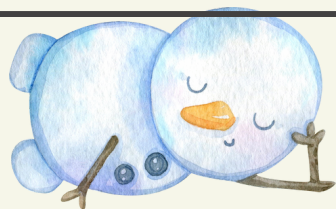

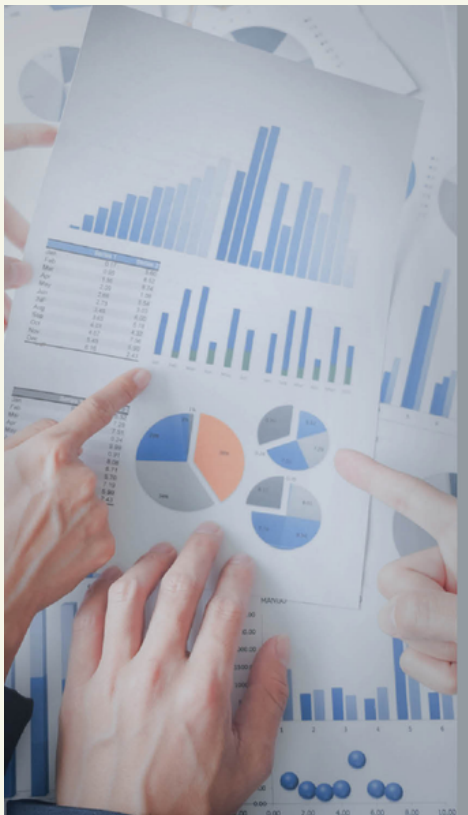

The RCA has set aside time during the week for you to come out and play with friends or family.

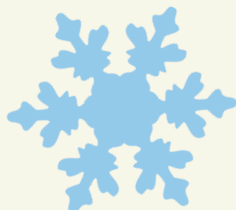
The drop in programs are open to anyone over the age of 16 years.

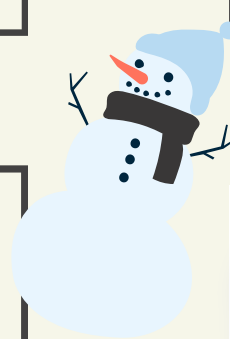

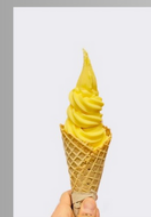

GRAFFITI

Graffiti is a crime and can be reported to police.

What can you do if you are a Victim of Graffiti?

- 1) **Record** - Take a picture of the graffiti vandalism as soon as it is identified.
- 2) **Report** - Report all incidents of damage to your property by calling
Saskatoon Police Service at 306-975-8300.
To report graffiti vandalism on property other than your own call 306-975-2828.
Report it online: <https://www.saskatoon.ca/webform/report-graffiti>
- 3) **Remove** - If the graffiti is on your property, remove it as quickly as possible. The faster and more frequently graffiti is cleaned up, the less it reappears.

Outdoor Winter Activities

Cameco Meewasin Skating Rink @ NutrienPlaza	Make your way to the Cameco Meewasin Rink @ NutrienPlaza to enjoy gliding with amazing views of the South Saskatchewan River. Admission to the rink and skate rentals are by donation.
Clarence Downey Speed Skating Oval	No need for speed skates to enjoy skating at the 400m Oval - there are four lanes for different speeds and lots of room for every level of skater.
Cross Country Ski Trails	Trail updates are available here or for more information call 306-975-3300 (Mon-Fri). Nordic Ski Club also offers lessons for children, youth and adults in Kinsmen Park.
Dog Parks	Enjoy time with your dog at one of the City's off-leash dog parks.
Geocaching	Geocaching is a outdoor treasure hunt using GPS enabled devices. With a free membership at Geocaching.com, all the information you need is there to get you started. There are over 2000 geocaches in the Saskatoon area. Contact the local group Saskatoon and Area Geocaching Association (SAGA) at www.saskatoongeocachers.weebly.com for more information.
Meewasin Trail & River Landing	The Meewasin Trail is home to beautiful pathways that wind along the South Saskatchewan riverbank and displays stunning views of both downtown and the forested riverbank. The Meewasin Trail runs through River Landing, where an Outdoor Adult Fitness Circuit and Pavilion Building public washrooms are open all year round. A Ceremonial Fire Vessel is also available for rent as a warming and gathering place.
Optimist Hill	Optimist Hill is a winter recreation area with a ski/snowboarding section, a terrain park and a tubing hill. There is also a free toboggan hill for families to enjoy.
Outdoor Skating Rinks & Ponds	There are over 50 Community Association owned and operated outdoor rinks located in neighbourhoods throughout Saskatoon. There are also several storm water ponds that may be used for recreational purposes, including skating and ice hockey. All users of the ponds do so at their own risk.
Saskatoon Forestry Farm Park & Zoo	Take a winter walk around the Zoo and enjoy the animals out active in the winter months. Admission is by donation until March 31. Closed on December 25.
Tobogganing	Several parks around Saskatoon have tobogganing hills for families to enjoy. Visit Toboggan Hills to view a map with 28 tobogganing locations, as well as important safety tips to keep in mind before heading to the hill.
Winter Play Programs	The City of Saskatoon offers FREE Winter Play Programs for children and families to engage in physical activity while developing new and improved skills in classic Canadian or Indigenous winter sports. Refer to the Winter Leisure Guide for more information.
Winter Birding	Living Sky Wildlife Rehabilitation offers private guided birding tours in a variety of parks in and near Saskatoon throughout the winter season. It is common to find many varieties of woodpeckers, finches and other winter songbirds in the wooded portions of Saskatoon's naturalized parks. At special locations, chickadees will land on your hand to feed on sunflower seeds. Near the end of the winter season, tours will watch for dancing grouse. Help the Saskatoon Nature Society survey winter bird populations by participating in the Boxing Day Bird Count. At this time every winter, birders from across the world spend a day counting the wild birds in their neighbourhood. The results of these annual surveys help establish trends in bird populations and assist in conservation initiatives. Email trips@saskatoonnature.org for more information.
